Most people walk away with a feeling of "why didn't this get covered in High School history class?" A trip that takes wartime history as a theme would be amiss without considering a visit to the memorial sites in Phnom Penh. The added value of meeting with a survivor while shedding light on the resilience of the Khmer people. Phnom Penh is not all doom-and-gloom of course and the buzzing modern city is fun to explore in the evening via the iconic tuk-tuk. Our hosts are Cambodian-Americans, deported from America, now running educational tours in their ancestral homeland for a totally different perspective on the city.

DAY TUK TUK ADVENTURE WITH A TWIST

Cruising through traffic frenzy, sampling street food, and ending with a sundowner on the roof of the Foreign Correspondents Club (FCC), which was a prominent bar during the early nineties when the UN was sponsoring an election.

The evening will be hosted, in part, by a Khmer-American deportee who will offer an interesting perspective on the legacies of warfare, growing up in the States, and ultimately being forced to settle in Cambodia.

DAY VISIT TO S-21 PRISON AND MEET WITH A SURVIVOR

A sobering visit to S21 the school turned into a prison that was used to document and interrogate perceived enemies of the state before they were sent to the Killing Fields.

This is an extremely moving, quiet educational experience.

The lessons of the day will be amplified afterwards when you have lunch with Mr Nong Sophal, a genocide survivor.

We can also visit the Killing Fields.

The morning is set for an exploration of quintessential Angkor, trusting a local expert on the ancient temple ruins to show you the immensely intricate and mysterious structures in all their glory, focusing on historical nuance and, of course, capturing the finest angles.

In the afternoon we will visit the country villa of Kiwi-Cambodian chef Kethana Dunnett, who with her husband Bruce, owns Sugar Palm, one of Siem Reap's best Cambodian restaurants. On the way back to town we can stop by the Landmine Museum with a private viewing led by Aki Ra, a former soldier-turned-demining specialist.
